Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) is working to prevent sewage overflows in Ballard. Last year, 89 overflows sent 57 million gallons of raw sewage and polluted stormwater runoff into Salmon Bay.

SPU is building infrastructure - like underground storage and natural drainage systems - to reduce these overflows. After months of technical analysis and input from the community, SPU has identified the most-

promising locations for natural drainage. See the map inside.

If you live on these blocks, SPU wants to hear from you. Join us to discuss the project: June 5, 6-8 p.m., Northminster Presbyterian Church, 7706 25th Ave NW.

SPU will continue to talk with residents this summer to gather feedback. In fall 2013 SPU will announce its recommendation and will work with residents on block designs through 2014. Construction would begin in 2015.
